In 2010, for the first time in the 34 years of running historical dance schools, the Nonsuch Summer School will be open to both dancers and instrumental musicians who would like to play for dancing. Over four full days of classes the course will follow the historical development in dance, from the earliest medieval references to the twentieth century.

Highlights will include dances connected to the local area, including Knaresborough Castle, Ripley Castle, Castle Howard, The Victorian Spa and Pump Rooms, and Agatha Christie.

The Summer Course syllabus offers an Introduction to the History of Dance from the Royal Courts of Europe.

NONSUCH HISTORICAL DANCE & MUSIC COURSE

20 – 24 AUGUST 2010

Come and become a royal courtier at the Nonsuch Summer School, where you will be instructed in the movement and etiquette of each period of history, learning the style of dance fashionable at the Royal Courts in Europe.



Musicians will be tutored in dance music of each style, becoming an instrumental consort to accompany the dancers for evenings of historical social dance. Moving from the basic principles of social dance established in the Mediaeval period, we explore the codes of behaviour from the Renaissance and Baroque, and consider the rules and regulations of the Regency period of Jane Austen, and the pomp and elegance of Queen Victoria.



An introduction to each dance style will be given, and a sample of formal dances and reconstructed choreographies will be taught in detail. Tutoring will be tailored to your own level and experience, so that you can join in the fun of the festivities!

In addition to instrumental consort, all students may participate in singing, from Medieval Caroling to Victorian part songs.

DANCE - DARREN ROYSTON (Artistic Director) has used his specialist knowledge in historical dance and period movement to teach actors, singers, children and adults, including choreography in theatre, opera, film and TV, and as Associate at the Royal Academy of Dramatic Art (RADA).



MUSIC - RALPH WOODWARD (Historical Music Director) was organ scholar at Queens' College, Cambridge and is now a freelance conductor and keyboard player. He is Musical Director of Fairhaven Singers, Full Score and the Northumbrian Recorder & Viol School. He has worked with ensembles and soloists, including The Parley of Instruments, Christopher Hogwood, and Emma Kirkby. Ralph will be joined by members of The Lovekyn Consort.

WILLIAM SUMMERS (Director) teaches at Morley College, London specialising in early recorders, flutes, windcap instruments. BEN SANSOM (leader) is a freelance violinist and viola player with extensive experience in leading, directing and orchestral playing.
